Historical Trends


- Post-World War II Policy

Recent International and Regional Trends


- Shifting global power

US Direction of Total Trade, 2009






LAC Direction of Trade (2009 exports)




Latin America and Caribbean: Exports by Main Market (as % of total)





Origin of FDI - 2010




Evolution of China's Trade With Latin America

China's Bilateral Trade With Latin America (US\$Bn)








Brazil in the World

 - Lula's policy of "benign restraint"


Foreign Direct Investment in Brazil (billions \$)
